

Wolverines Hockey Club Player Assistance Fund

The Wolverines Hockey Club Player Assistance Fund assists Wolverines families who are experiencing financial hardship. The Player Assistance Fund is available to help with registration fees and/or cash calls. Families interested in receiving funding through the Player Assistance Fund are asked to complete an application to determine eligibility.

Families requesting financial assistance from the WHC Player Assistance Fund are asked to first apply for subsidy through other available sources. Please provide proof of application along with your WHC Player Assistance Fund application:

How to qualify?

- Players must be registered with WHC for the current season
- Applicants must meet financial eligibility requirements to qualify for assistance
- ➤ Parent or guardian must submit the WHC Player Assistance Fund application, proof of application for external subsidy (ie: Flames EvenStrength Program) and Revenue Canada notice of assessment from the previous tax year

How much financial support is provided?

The amount of assistance provided to approved applicants will be determined by an internal committee based on the amount of funding available for the current season

What is the deadline to apply?

- Please submit your application as soon as you register
- The application deadline is Oct 15 of the current season

How to apply?

- Complete the Player Assistance Fund application (1 application per player) and submit it by email to info@wolverineshockey.ca
- Include proof of household income (tax assessments from previous year for all adults in the home)
- Include proof of application to external subsidy

- > Once received, applications will be reviewed within 30 days
- Registration fee assistance will be allocated directly towards the players fees
- > Cash call assistance will be given directly to the players team treasurer/manager

Who will see the applications?

- Wolverines Hockey has created a Player Assistance Fund committee consisting of; the Registrar, the Wolverines Treasurer and 1 other member of the Board of Directors
- > Once the Registrar receives the applications, all identifying information will be removed and the applications will be forwarded to the other committee members. The committee will review the applications to determine their eligibility for approval.
